


As an undergraduate at Princeton University, Leonard D. Schaeffer spent a summer interning in Washington, D.C. for former U.S. Senator Paul Douglas (IL). The mentors

he learned from and networks he built helped begin a career in public service at both the state and federal level.

He later worked in both for-profit and notfor-profit organizations and founded the Schaeffer Fellows in Government Service program to expose undergraduates to government operations and encourage their continued civic engagement. Now in its sixth year, the program has supported nearly 200 Schaeffer Fellows.







A DEVELOPMENTAL EXPERIENCE

Presented in collaboration with the Partnership for Public Service, the Schaeffer Fellows professional development curriculum provides tools for early-career undergraduate students to foster camaraderie, cooperation, and networking around **four key themes:**

- Reflecting on core values
- Exploring leadership lessons
- Collaborating and networking
- Developing transferable skills

NATIONAL COHORT

Five partner universities each select 10 Schaeffer Fellows annually. Fellows represent a diversity of backgrounds, political perspectives, and academic disciplines. Common among them is an interest in learning more about public service and the role of government.

ANNUAL SCHAEFFER FELLOWS SUMMIT

Held in Washington, D.C. each summer, the Summit brings together the national cohort of 50 Fellows to participate in reflection, teambuilding, and career exploration through:

- Interactive workshops
- Site visits with nonpartisan organizations in D.C.
- Guest speakers including public service professionals and alumni Fellows
- Time to explore D.C. and a cohort dinner hosted in Mr. Schaeffer's home
